

FAMILY FUN IN RENO TAHOE - SUMMER

Families visiting Reno-Tahoe can choose from a wide variety of activities to make their trips memorable and fun.

This summer itinerary starts in Reno, Nevada.

Day 1

Stay in downtown Reno for this summer getaway. On the first day, check out the [Truckee River Whitewater Park](#) at Wingfield Park. Situated in the heart of downtown Reno's [Riverwalk District](#), the park offers dipping pools that are perfect for a swim on a hot Northern Nevada day. Feeling more adventurous? [Rent a kayak or raft](#), and take on the class 3 rapids. Although the whitewater park is a world-class attraction for kayakers throughout the U.S. - especially during the annual [Reno River Festival](#) - it is tame enough for novices.

In the evening, check out some [chic boutiques](#) before settling in for a great meal at Silver Peak Grille and Taproom, located at the corner of First and Sierra streets, an easy stroll from downtown hotel and casino resorts. Other [dining options](#) include the Wild River Grill or Campo if you prefer dining on the river. Reno's summer evenings are famously warm, so try to get a seat on the patio. For a cozier atmosphere, try La Famiglia at the corner of Virginia and State streets, or indulge in the local Basque culture at Louis' Basque Corner or the Santa Fe.

Day 2

No visit to Reno-Tahoe is complete without seeing the pristine waters of Lake Tahoe, the "Jewel of the Sierra." Take the 45-minute drive up the Mt. Rose Highway (Highway 431), to find the community of Incline Village in [North Lake Tahoe](#). Sand Harbor is a great place to soak in the sun and play in the water, whether you prefer a casual cocktail by the lake, a guided [kayak tour](#), or a picnic.

Lake Tahoe is the consummate outdoor playground, so take a [hike](#), ride a [bike](#) or rent an [ATV](#) and take to the hills. Families can also enjoy a Tahoe tradition by taking in a performance during the [Lake Tahoe Shakespeare Festival](#), which fills the calendar during evenings in July and August.

Enjoy the slightly cooler mountain air at the lake and dine al fresco at the Lone Eagle Grill at the [Hyatt Regency](#) in Incline Village. For a more casual setting, take the family to [Tomaato's](#) for local, all natural and organic pizza.
